The selected candidate must have the ability to adapt to flexible work schedules and frequent interruptions; provide leadership to a diverse group of managers and providers in four locations; and be able to effectively communicate with the public and other community leaders.

Participation in related local, state, and regional healthcare associations is required and therefore will include some travel time. As an ambassador to the local communities through community participation, the candidate must reside in the Beulah/Hazen area.

EDUCATION/EXPERIENCE

Minimum of a Bachelor degree in Healthcare Administration or a related field, and/or a combination of education and experience in healthcare is required.

Must possess detailed knowledge of the operations of a Critical Access Hospital (CAH) or Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC) and other healthcare related services.
